

Before we enter the Lenten fast,
we are reminded that there
can be no true fast,
no genuine repentance, no
reconciliation with God,
unless we are at the same time
reconciled with one another.

On the evening of the Sunday of Forgiveness. the Church conducts the first service of Great Fast, the service that directs us further on the path of repentance and helps us to acknowledge our need for forgiveness from God and to seek forgiveness from our brothers and sisters in Christ.

This is the first time that the Lenten prayer of St. Ephraim accompanied by prostrations is read. At the end of the service all the faithful approach the priest and one another asking for mutual forgiveness.


