

#### *Lent Begins* February 27, 2023

"Lent is the period of time for selfexamination by the believer; of putting on the spiritual armor of the Militant Church; of applying the riches of prayers and almsgiving; of adopting deeply the meaning of repentance; of atonement and reconciliation with God Almighty."

#### **Forgiveness Vespers**

B efore we entered the Lenten fast, we were reminded that there can be no true fast, no genuine repentance, no reconciliation with God, unless we are at the same time reconciled with one another.

On the evening of the Sunday of Forgiveness, the Church conducted the first service of the Great Fast. This service directs us further on the path of repentance and helps us to acknowledge our need for forgiveness from God and to seek forgiveness from our brothers and sisters in Christ.

#### **Clean Monday**

O ur clergy, staff and ministry leaders came together for teaching, prayer and strength for the fast. Each found a quiet place within the sanctuary to pray the Jesus Prayer separately and came back together to discuss our thoughts.

#### Weekly Services and teachings

The first week of Lent had an intensified service schedule with daily compline and the reading of the Canon of St. Andrew. The weeks that followed held Great Compline services on Mondays. Presanctified Divine Liturgy followed by teaching by Fr. Andreas along with a lenten dinner was held on Wednesdays. On Thursdays we offered a time over the lunch hour for parishioners to listen to teaching by guest speakers called, "Lent, Lunch and Learn. On Fridays we held Presanctified Divine Liturgy during the day and Small compline with Salutations to the Theotokos.in the evening.

### Holy and Great Saturday

**Pictured left:** This year, on the morning of Holy and Great Saturday, our catechumens were baptized. This service was full of the coming Paschal joy. After the reading of the Epistle, the priests followed the custom of the tossing of laurel and flower petals, saying:

#### "Arise, O God, and judge Thou the earth: for Thou shall take all heathen to Thine inheritance".

Parishioners brought in baskets filled with their Paschal meal to break the fast after midnight. Tables of food were blessed at the end of the service.





#### Midnight Resurrection Service

B efore midnight, the congregation gathered and sat in a dimly lighted sanctuary. A few minutes before midnight the sanctuary darkened. The Fathers come out with one candle singing: "Come ye and receive light from the unwaning life, and glorify Christ, who arose from the dead." The priests then lit the acolytes' candles and each acolyte lit the candle of the person at the end of the each pew until all candles were lit and the sanctuary was glowing with the joyous light of Pascha.
